


### **Kuhl Hose 2013 Annual Report**




Total Calls - 523

1948, Post War America, Greene Township a small rural farm community, was struggling to become a better place. In an effort to progress forward, a group known as the "East Greene Community Organization" consisting of husbands and wives, who had been meeting for several years decided to start a Fire Company. Prior to the Kuhl Hose Company if there was a fire or other emergency in Greene Township, companies from Belle Valley, Wattsburg, Stancliff (Waterford,) or North East were summoned to help. By the time those Fire Companies arrived there was not much to save due to their distance and no prompt way for them to be notified.

A group of 11 men at a meeting October 31, 1948, signed the paperwork for a charter and sent it along with \$35 of their own money to Harrisburg. The dedication of the men from the first meeting continues today in the organization that they built, Kuhl Hose Company.

Kuhl Hose is celebrating 65 years of service to the community in 2014 with a dedicated group of citizens who give back to their community day and night providing fire, rescue and ambulance services. Our roster boasts a nicely aggregated list of men and women from many walks of life and experience including: Farmers, business men and women, fulltime health care providers, teachers, truck drivers and local home owners including young citizens. Each member commits many hours of service that include training, fundraising and business management while answering over 500 emergency calls in 2013 alone. Their dedication to community is often only recognized by their families, and their fellow firefighters, who truly realize what today volunteer firefighters commit to do.

On behalf of the members of the Kuhl Hose Company, it is with a great sense of pride and accomplishment that we present to you the 2013 Year End Report.

The year 2013 again proved to be a busy year for emergency responses. A total of 523 runs were made. Although this is not a record year it is a larger number of responses than in the previous few years.

State required certification and re-certifications for our firefighters and Emergency Medical Service personnel requires many hours of continuing education. We strive to provide excellent training programs that fulfill minimum state requirements. To maintain excellence, our personnel need continued exposure to additional education, through various schools and seminars, in EMS and fire.

With equipment, education and training we are able to continue to hold the Voluntary Rescue Recognition Programs Basic level certification as well are currently at 56% and continue to work toward our 100% goal participation in the State program for fire department professional certification recognition.

The accomplishments of the Kuhl Hose Company in 2013 were only possible through the ongoing dedication of each member and their commitment to our community. It is to each of them that I extend my appreciation. I am very proud of our members and their accomplishments and I am excited to see our organization continue to improve and grow in 2014 as we begin celebrating our 65th Anniversary.

# From the Safety Officer Carl D. Martin - 68-S1


This year we developed and implemented a safety committee. It was formed to allow broader examination of incidents and concerns. The committee meets once a month, reviews any incidents and safety concerns, makes recommendations to the Fire Chief and President who addresses the issues or gives direction to the committee. The committee also conducted building inspections, maintain a log of all safety concerns and incidents allowing us tracking and easier follow up. The committee concerned over one injury on the fire ground secured and installed safety guards on the fol-da-tanks.


# From the President Chuck Will

Annually, Kuhl Hose raises over a quarter-of-a -million dollars with volunteer workers. All the money is used to provide equipment, training and facilities for Greene Township and our neighboring communities.





In 2013, Kuhl Hose began budgeting to acquire a piece of land to build a new fire station. This fire station would replace the two smaller fire stations on Kuhl and Barton Roads. These fire stations are nearly 60 years old and are too small for modern fire apparatus. As well a new station will provide many new options for the department and community. This proposed fire station will be planned and built to protect Greene Township for the next 75 or more years. It is expected to take 5 to 10 years before a new fire station will be built allowing time to raise the needed funds. Kuhl Hose will continue to maintain the existing fire station at Rt 8 and Rescue Lane. This station will remain and continue to be our main building.








### 2013 Fire Police Response Map
